2 RCDF, Uganda's USF

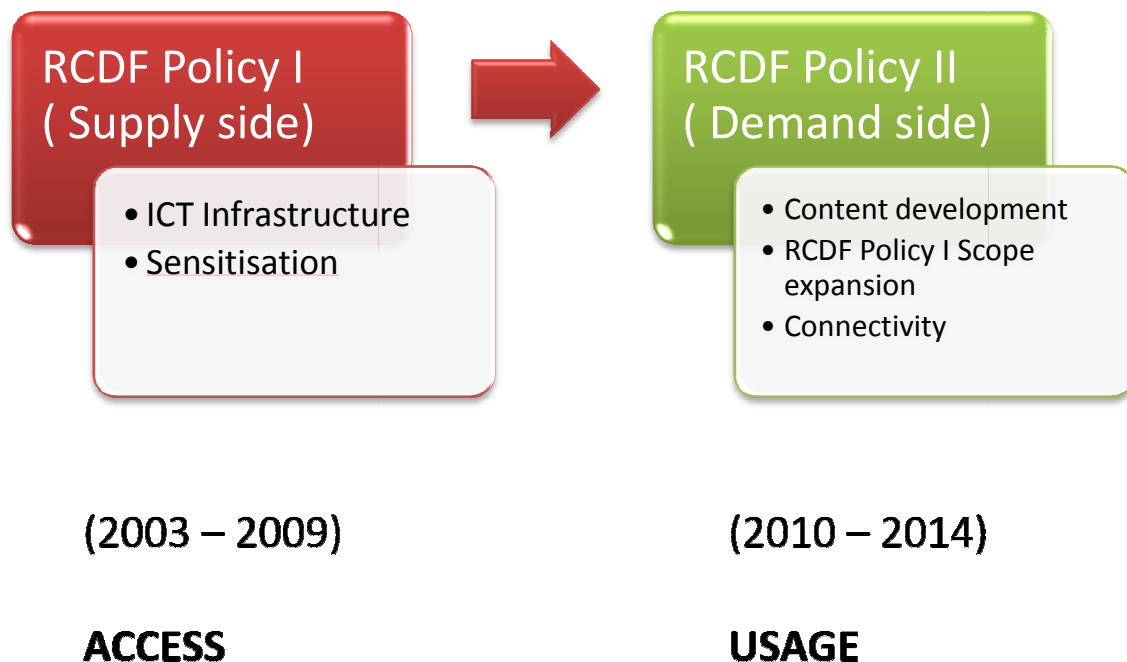
The Rural Communications Development Fund (RCDF) is a Universal Service Fund (USF) to communication services in Uganda. It was commissioned in 2003 and it is administered at arms' length by the Uganda Communications Commission (UCC).

The main objective of RCDF is to contribute to the realisation of Universal Access to communications in Uganda through establishment of communications projects in areas that are left un-served or underserved through market operations.

3 The RCDF Policy

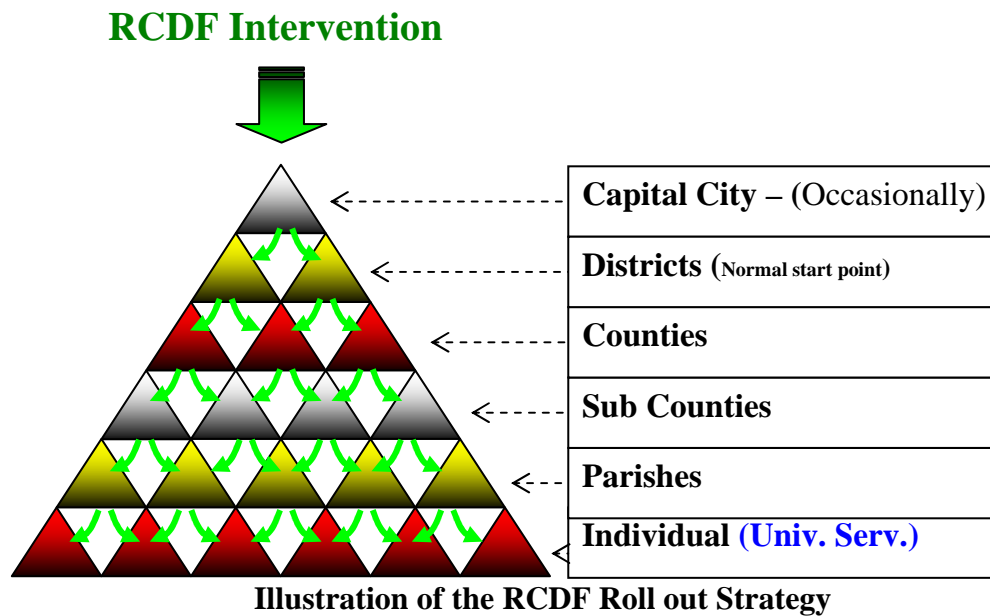
RCDF activities started with the first RCDF Policy of 2001 whose implementation started in the year 2003. Under this Policy, the main goal was to provide access to basic ICT in rural and underserved communities of Uganda.

Following the realization of the goal of the RCDF Policy of 2001, and the changes in the external and internal environment of RCDF, a new policy, the RCDF Policy of 2010/11 – 2014/15 was adopted with its main goal being the enhancement of usage of ICT in the rural and underserved communities of Uganda.



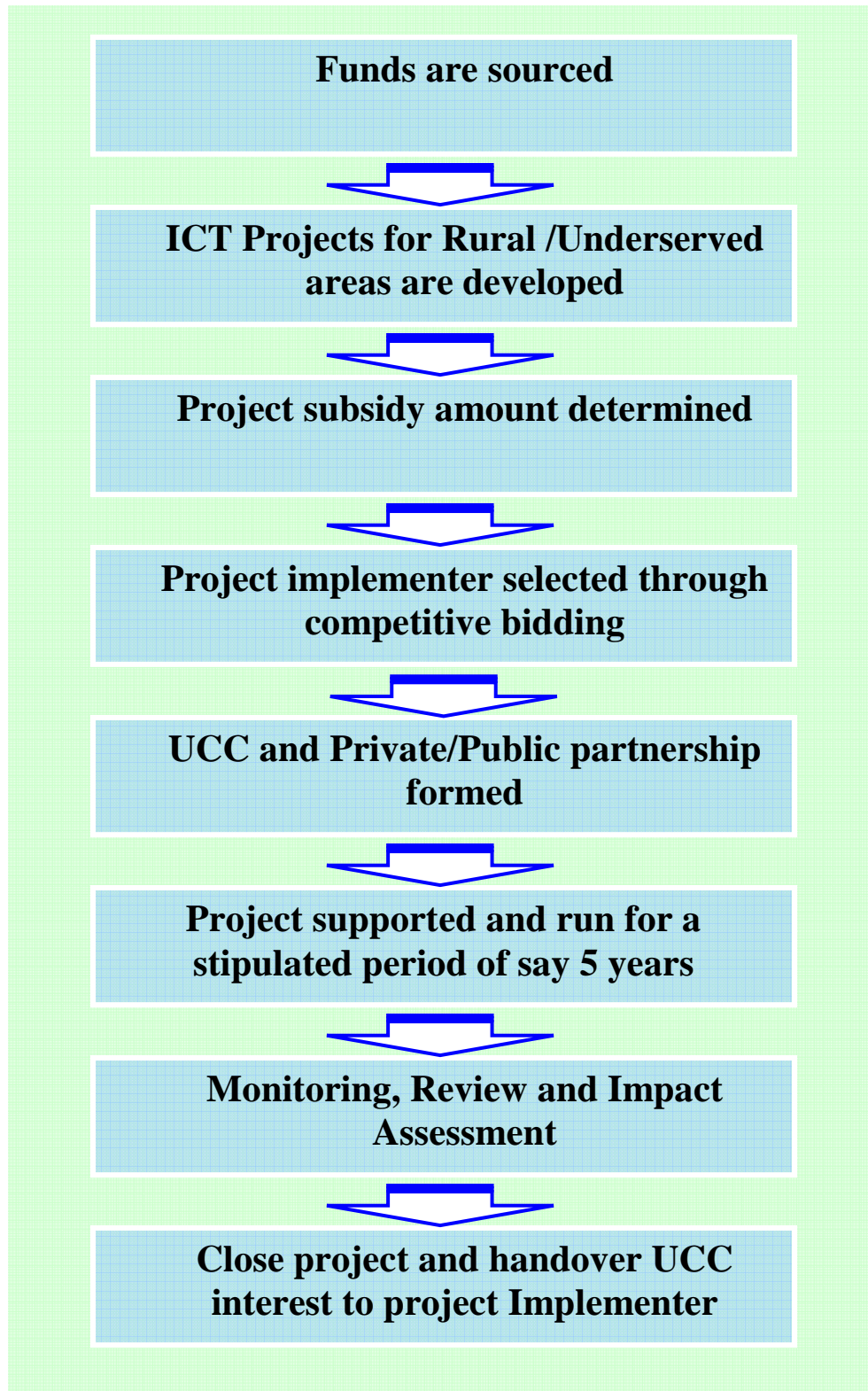
4 RCDF Projects implementation strategy

Roll out starts at the district centre and then moves into the lower administrative units of the district. This roll out strategy allows for service to start where it is most needed, where it is most sustainable and allows for awareness into the remote areas to subsequently take effect before ICT services get there.



Implementation of the RCDF programme is a sequential and cyclic process. UCC defines underserved areas in line with the RCDF policy programme. Projects that can deliver sustainable communications services to the underserved areas are then developed. Implementers of the projects are sought through a competitive bidding process. Financial subsidies are extended to project implementers. Implementation of the projects is governed by contractual terms which ensure that the policy objectives of RCDF are realised.

The project implementer owns the project. UCC monitors and offers technical support to the project throughout its stipulated project life. As the owner, the project implementer enjoys all the direct benefits accruing from the project and also bears all its normal risks. The projects are designed in such a way that they stimulate similar projects to be started in the underserved areas without further intervention from RCDF.

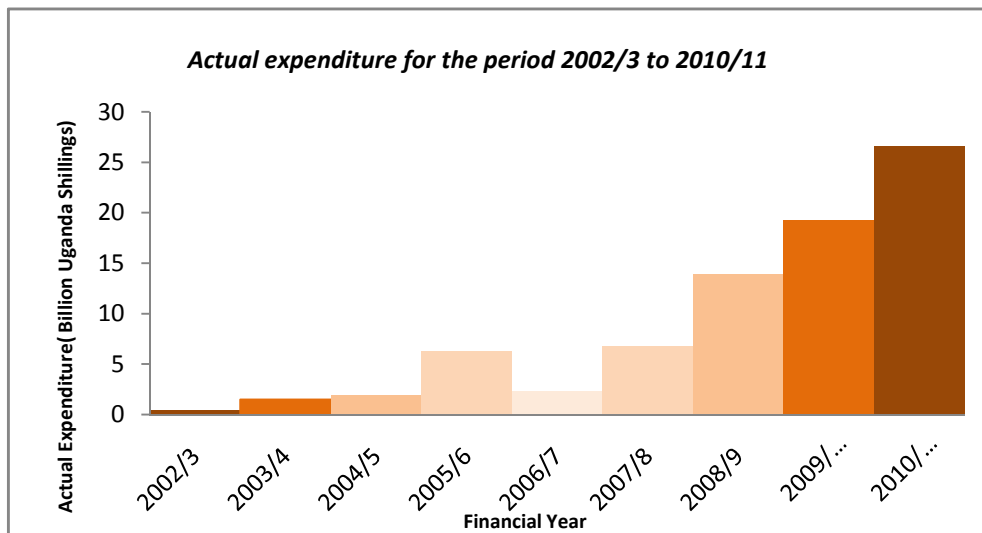
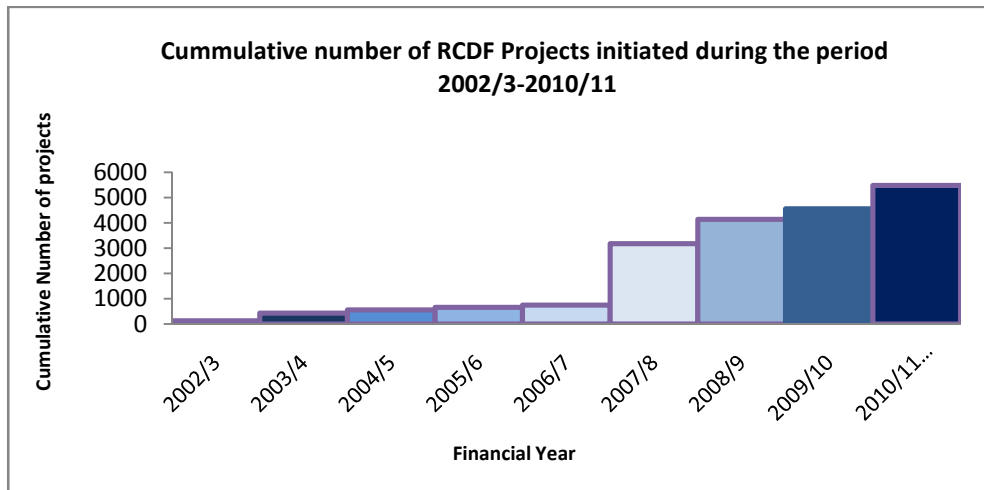


RCDF Projects Implementation Process

5 RCDF Results

The total number of RCDF projects expected to have been completed by the end of the financial year 2010/11 is 5,301; Internet points of presence (POP) - 76, Internet cafes - 106, ICT training centres - 78, Public payphones - 4,099, District web portals - 78, Multi Purpose Community Tele-centres (POP) - 13, Postal projects - 45, School ICT laboratories - 708, Health ICT facilities - 174, Voice network sites - 90, Content development projects - 106, Local governance projects 2, and Other unique projects - 31.

The total amount of money committed by the end of the financial year 2010/11 is Uganda Shillings 79.1 Billion (About US \$ 40 Million)

6 Sources of funding

RCDF may receive funding from the following sources;

- (i) Money appropriated by Parliament (National budget)
- (ii) Donations and grants from development partners
- (iii) Money from the Uganda Communications Commission
- (iv) Donations, gifts, grants and loans acceptable to the Minister of ICT and the Minister responsible for Finance

RCDF has mainly employed funding from two of the above sources;

- Money from the Uganda Communications commission particularly from the 1% levy on Gross Annual Revenue (GAR) form operators
- Donations and grants from development partners

Other sources of funds are expected to be invoked as the scope of activities expands.

7 Administration and Management

RCDF is administered by UCC at arms' length. Its management is defined by *Statutory Instrument 2002, No 52* and it is directed by a dedicated Board of Directors. The Board is composed of the following persons;

- 1) One Commissioner of the Uganda Communications Commission who shall be the Chairperson of the Board;
- 2) The Executive Director of Uganda Communications Commission;
- 3) A representative of the Minister responsible for Communications who shall be an ex-officio member;

The following persons appointed by the Commission.

- 4) A nominee of the communications sector nominated for appointment by the major license holders;
- 5) A nominee of recognized consumer associations;
- 6) A nominee of the financial sector nominated for appointment by the Uganda Institute of Bankers;
- 7) A nominee of the Uganda Institute of Professional Engineers nominated for appointment by the Uganda Institute of Professional Engineers.

Apart from the Executive Director of UCC, a member is appointed for a term (three years) and is eligible for re-appointment for one more term.

Except for general directions on matters of policy given to the Board from time to time by the Commission, the Board is independent of the Commission in the performance of its duties and functions.

8 Impact

Through RCDF's own monitoring and evaluation processes, the direct impact of the RCDF projects that is observed is as follows;

- Extension of the wireless voice network for Uganda from 85% to 100% at the sub county level
- Provision of a wireless internet network in all 80 district towns of Uganda that existed by 2008
- Providing the required ICT infrastructure in government secondary schools for ICT integration into the secondary school curriculum of Uganda
- Enabling Tele-medicine usage in all district health facilities of Uganda through the provision of the required ICT infrastructure.
- Appropriate technologies and sustainable methods of delivery of ICT employed by RCDF get replicated by the private sector.

9 Key Stakeholders' responsibilities

The key stakeholders for implementation of RCDF projects are;

- Ministry of ICT;
- A government Ministry in case of the public sector;
- End user
- Area local leadership.

The typical roles that each of the various stakeholder group plays are as shown in the table below:

10 Projects Profile

In line with the RCDF policy provisions, RCDF projects have been implemented in districts of Uganda under the following program areas; internet points of presence (POP), Public payphones, Research projects, Postal support projects, District web portals, Multipurpose Community Tele - centres (MCT's), Voice network coverage expansion, Local governance enhancement, School ICT facilities, Health Care ICT facilities, ICT training centres and Internet cafes and a few special category projects such as the Postcode pilot project.

10.1 Internet Points of Presence (POP)

The internet POPs provide a wireless connectivity network for a radius of about 5-10km around the POP. People within this area can access internet connectivity at costs, speeds and types of services that are comparable to those in the capital city, Kampala.

All who wish to make use of the POP in a district need to contact the operator who first established the POP, supported by RCDF in that district. Through their own expansion programmes other operators also continue to establish their own POPs in various districts of the country.

10.2 Internet Cafes/ICT Training Centres

This program provides public access to internet and ICT training services to people around a district town.

Like all other projects of RCDF, the facilities are established as partnerships between UCC and a private or public partner.

The ICT training centre/Internet café is made up of a minimum of 5 computers that are all connected to the internet. Services provided at the ICT training centre/Internet café are paid for at market competitive rates for the area. Other people in several other districts have replicated the internet cafes/ICT training centres and offer similar or better services. A user may therefore need to compare the services in all the cafes in the area for a better deal.

10.3 District Web Portals

District web portals were developed and handed over to the district local administrations. The district web portal names take the general form:

www.district name.go.ug

Common information provided by the district web portals include; the district overview, Health, Agriculture, Education, Government & Politics, Investment & trade, Tourism, Government Programs, Environment, an SMS services, Infrastructure, news and district contacts. The web portal also provides a translation into a common language found in the district.

The web portals may also be used for generation of income to districts through activities such as renting out space to advertisers. The district Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) is the official responsible for all issues regarding the management, annual fees, updating and uses of a district web portal

Districts are encouraged to redesign them to suit their preferences. The usual web hosting and maintenance fees average around US \$ 200 per year.

10.4 Public Pay phones

The Public Pay phones are of two main forms;

- (i) The Standard type that is only limited to initiation of calls
- (ii) A Community Information Center (CIC) which is used for both initiation and limited termination of calls.

The CIC also provides other services such as charging of phones

10.5 Voice Network Expansion Project

UCC through the RCDF programme provided a subsidy to operators to establish a network to places that did not have voice network coverage in the district. Under this program the mobile voice communication network was extended to 154 sub counties.

The net effect of this project has been the attainment of 100% GSM Network coverage for Uganda at the Sub county level; however at the lower administrative levels such as parishes pockets still exist where there is no network coverage.

10.6 School ICT Laboratories

This program provides support to the Ministry of Education and Sports to integrate access and usage of ICT in schools. Priority for schools in this program has been made for government schools and similar training institutions. The program is comprised of three main projects listed below;

- (i) A Project for establishment of ICT laboratories
- (ii) A Project for providing internet Connectivity
- (iii) A Project for supporting Content delivery

The program enables schools to among other things;

- Teach computer studies as a curriculum subject at O-level
- Teach general purpose computer applications such as MS Office Packages aimed at providing computer literacy
- Access local learning resources such as UNEB examination past papers on web portals like www.uderb.org

- Access to the Internet and use of e-mail services
- Use of computer-based learning aides such as the ENCARTA package to support the teaching and learning of conventional curriculum subjects.
- Access to other internet based e-learning resources.

Ministry of Education and Sports has the oversight role for the school ICT laboratories that are established and all their activities.

10.7 Health ICT Facilities

This program provides support to the Ministry of Health to enhance usage of ICT in Health services delivery in the country. Through the program, ICT facilities are installed in selected government health facilities under two major program areas of e-health which are;

- (a) The Tele-medicine
- (b) The e-Health Management Information System (e-HMIS)

A three cycle strategy is employed for the roll out of the programme as illustrated below;

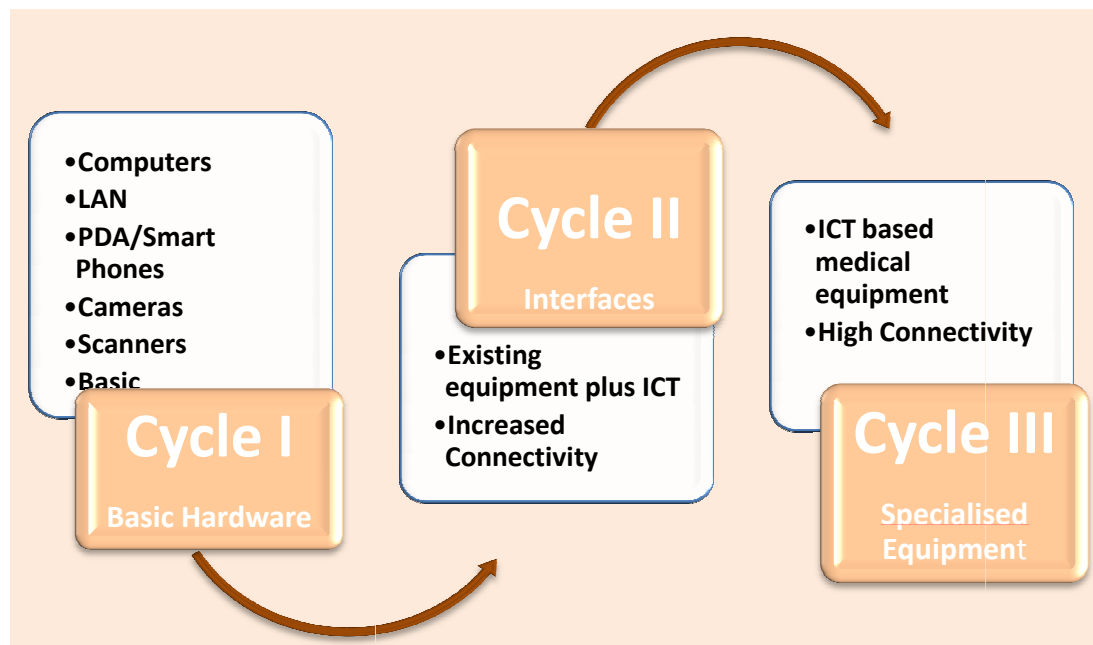


Illustration of the three progressive cycles for implementation of ICT in the Health sector

The program enables health facilities and health practitioners to among other things access the following health related ICT services;

- Interlink all DHO's, all Government Hospitals, 50 major Health Center IV facilities, and the Ministry of Health head quarters and referral hospitals.
- Access to the Ministry of Health web portal www.health.go.ug
- e-continued medical education
- Access to online medical journals
- Access to selected e-libraries
- Support for e-consultation at the national & international level
- Support for e-Health Management Information Systems (e-HMIS)

The advanced Telemedicine pilot project

Through a partnership of various stakeholders organised by the Ministry of Health that include UCC, SPIDER SURE, Karolinska University Hospital and Makerere University, a pilot project for advanced Telemedicine in Uganda was developed and implemented in Isingiro district. The project is code named the *ICT4MPower* project. Upon successful integration of ICT in Isingiro district, the system will be replicated to all other districts of Uganda and integrated into a national e-health ICT system.

The Ministry of Health has the oversight role for established ICT facilities and all associated activities.

10.8 Postal Tele - centers & Postal Expansion Projects

A program was implemented for the establishment of 25 postal offices at selected sub counties and establishment of 20 postal Tele-centers in 20 selected districts across the country.

UCC through the RCDF program is also extending financial support for the postcode pilot project of the country.

10.9 Multi Purpose Community Tele - Centers (MCT)

Multi Purpose Community Tele - centres provide a wider range of services than the ICT training centre and internet cafes. The typical additional services provided include video adult training programmes and sustainable rural business model demonstrations. MCTs are typically owned by sections of the community. Two models of Tele - centres have been piloted. One that is private sector owned and the other that is public sector owned.

In both cases public and private sector owned multipurpose community Tele - centres projects have experienced challenges of sustainability. This program therefore has been limited to the facilities of the pilot projects.

10.10 Governance Enhancement Programme for Local Administrations

Under this program a fully installed computer is supplied to the office of;

- (i) Each Resident District Commissioner's (RDC's) Office across the country.
- (ii) Each Member of Parliament (MP)

Through this program RDC's and MP's will have access to computer services that include;

- o Access to the Internet
- o Linkage with the Parent agency in Kampala (Presidents Office for RDC's and Parliament for MP's)
- o e-government systems

The main objective of this programme is to enhance the capacity of RDCs and MPs in overseeing and monitoring public programmes in districts such as the RCDF projects.

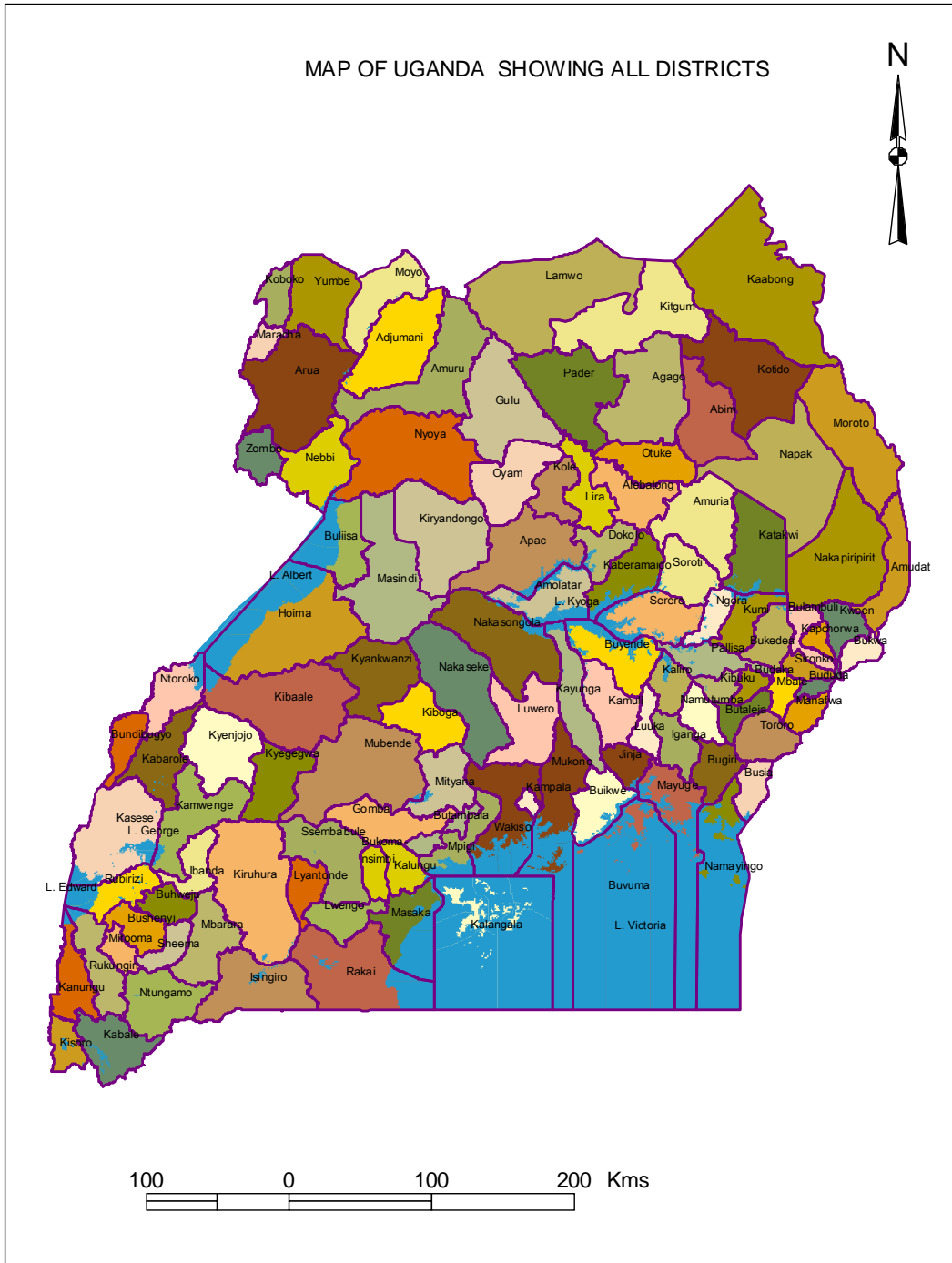
10.11 Other activities
